



BSA Honorary Life Membership

8.1.3 Honorary Life Member: Council may award Honorary Life Membership to a member with an outstanding record of service to Audiology or to the Society. Nominations will be sought on an annual basis from the membership, with evidence. The Officers will discuss nominations and make recommendations to Council.

Consideration for council deliberations:

- Has the nominee been a member of the BSA for a significant amount of time?
- Has the nominee made a positive contribution through-out their career?
- Are the nominee's contributions to the BSA and/or audiological science widely recognised?
- Does the nomination match the aims of the BSA?

Process for nomination:

- Call for nominations sent to all membership via regular updates
- Nomination received by Vice-Chair
- Eligibility checked with membership administration
- Nomination discussed at the House-keeping meeting
- Nomination tabled for discussion at the proceeding Council Meeting
- A Trustee majority vote in-favour is required for Honorary Life Membership to be conferred
- Membership administration will keep on record the completed nomination form
