Nominations are now invited for all the below awards but specifically those highlighted:

- The Thomas Simm Littler Lecturship Prize in recognition of an academic contribution to the discipline of audiology.
- The Ruth Spencer Prize in recognition of outstanding undergraduate Audiology work.

- *The George Harris People's Choice Award nominated by a service user or a family member or friend of a service user, this award is in recognition of significant impact to a service user or contribution in the field of adult rehabilitation or paediatric habilitation. The PSP is being led by the NIHR Nottingham Biomedical Research Centre (BRC) in partnership with Alzheimer's Research UK (ARUK) and RNID.

This grant, and other BMA Foundation grants are now **open** for online application via the BMA Foundation.


